Methodology / CLIL and Language Development

Course Overview

This course combines aspects of teaching methodology and CLIL – Content and Language Integrated Learning, by examining the methods that can be used by English Teachers and Teachers who deliver their subjects through English. The course provides opportunities for teachers to discuss and share ideas with colleagues from similar backgrounds.

Course Fees:

Course Info

Teacher training courses consist of 20 lessons per week, held from 9:30 to 13:00, Monday to Friday. There is also an afternoon program of lectures and visits. The courses run from **July 1st to July 26th**, covering Language Development, Methodology, and CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning).

Who is this course suitable for?

This course is designed for teachers who are looking to upskill in a number of areas. It also provides a focus on teachers who are currently in the process of integrating CLIL methodology into their classroom.

What is in this course?

The course is primarily focused on developing communication skills. However, the scheduling of this course is quite flexible due to the nature of it being tied to the needs of the participants. The needs analysis for this course is crucial as the outcome of this will constitute the primary content which the course participants will engage with. CES has been very involved in developing and delivering further development courses through the Comenius, Grundtvig, CIEP and Saxony-Anhalt programmes.

Frequently Asked Questions

When can I start my course?

Our 2026 timetable for our Teacher Training Courses in Dublin and Cork is available on our website. Courses are available in Edinburgh, London, Leeds & Worthing from 29th June 1st - 24th July.

What are the class times?

In Dublin and Cork, classes run from Monday to Friday from 9am to 1pm, with a break between 11am and 11.20am. Cultural sessions are offered on Tuesdays and Thursdays between 2pm and 4.30pm. Our Teacher Training Courses are 25 hours in total, as per the Erasmus+ requirement.

In the UK, classes run from Monday to Friday from 9:30 - 13:00 with an afternoon programme of lectures and visits.

What is the minimum level I have to be to join a teacher training course?

We ask that all participants have a minimum level of B2 so that they can fully benefit from the course.

Is there a social programme I can join?

Apart from the cultural sessions on Tuesdays and Thursdays, we have an extensive social programme for the rest of the week, which is displayed weekly in all buildings. All Teacher Training Course participants are welcome and encouraged to join these events and activities.

What if I find the course too difficult, can I move to another class?

Yes. It is possible to move to a General English class suited to your level. Please remember that the minimum level requirement for all Teacher Training Courses at CES is B2

Will I receive a certificate?

Yes. Each participant will receive a certificate detailing the course hours and dates on the final day of their course.

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
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
