The 2025 edition will focus on the critical challenge of the European Union's security and defense amidst crises such as nuclear

deterrence, the war in Ukraine, instability in Africa and the Middle East, and growing tensions in Southeast Asia.

The program's framework will be inspired by the Jubilee of Hope convened by the late Pope Francis, with a special focus on hope as a foundational virtue for public leadership.

The main goal is to prepare individuals to take on the responsibility of leading during this era of transformation, promoting the common good in all its dimensions.



The program blends interactive training sessions, hands-on workshops, and inspiring keynote lectures — all while offering unique opportunities to connect with a diverse network of peers and professionals.

Students will develop a bold and values-based strategy for Europe's security and defense in a multipolar world — one rooted in Catholic Social Teaching and guided by a commitment to peace, justice, and human dignity.

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Six distinct modules featuring **panel discussions and presentations** that will explore the challenge from various disciplines, adopting an open reason approach.

The pedagogical model is based on three steps: "*Detectar - Descubrir y Decidir"* (Detect—Discover—Decide), which has resonances with the wellknown "see—judge—act"

Participants will sharpen their ability to analyze global security challenges, refine decision-making, and understand how ethical frameworks shape policy.

The program comprises **125 hours (5 ECTS), spread over 9 in-person sessions from July 5th to 13th, 2025**, and has an academic commitment divided into:


Student Profile

80% Scholarship

- Covers €1,600 of the €2,000 program fee.
- Granted to exceptional candidates who demonstrate outstanding academic achievement, leadership qualities, and/or financial need.
- Early applicants receive priority consideration.

50% Scholarship

- Covers €1,000 of the €2,000 program fee.
- · Awarded to high-achieving candidates with a strong commitment to the program's mission.
- Preference is given to early applicants.

30% Scholarship

- Covers €600 of the €2,000 program fee.
- Designed for promising applicants who show academic merit and motivation.
- · Early applicants are prioritized.
