

Alexander Batthyány (*1971) studied philosophy (of psychology) at the University of Vienna, where he also obtained his Ph.D. in philosophy of science/psychology (in April 2001) and received training in psychotherapy (logotherapy & existential analysis) by Elisabeth Lukas. He then did his post doctoral studies on the history of ideas in psychology and psychiatry at PPKE.

From 2013 to 2022, he was professor and holder of the Viktor Frankl Chair of Philosophy and Psychology at the Internationalen Akademie für Philosophie in the Principality of Liechtenstein. As of 2014, he also is professor for existential psychology and psychotherapy at the Moscow Institute of Psychoanalysis (Russian Federation).

Batthyány is director of the Viktor Frankl Institute Vienna, first editor of the German Edition of the Collected Works of Viktor Frankl (14 volumes) and founded the bi-annual World Congress on Logotherapy and Existential Analysis (Vienna, Moscow, Valencia).

He lives in Vienna with his wife and children, and frequently commutes between Vienna and Budapest.
